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
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Book Reviews for September 2011

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Secrets Behind Great Macro Photography by Jim Zuckerman



Last week Jim Zuckerman told me that he has two new books out and that he would send me copies to review. Then he let me know that they were the new ebooks, which it seems that most photographers are now doing to replace the high cost of printed ones. This is not only the first time I have reviewed an ebook, but it is also the first time that I have even looked at one. I had felt that I would have problems with this new form of publishing since you can not hold something in your hands and compare several pages to each other at the same time, but I also knew that there would probably be some good features to this kind of information, and I was right in both cases.


Jim said that I would really be surprised at the images in his book because on the monitor screen they are now back-lit and show up like nothing you have ever seen a printed book. He was sure right about that. There is one picture of a "very" large tarantula sitting on top of a flower, and when you see it you feel like you have a great need to back up real fast.

Secrets Behind Great Macro Photography has 7 chapters on 73 pages where Jim covers the equipment needed and the technical aspects of macro work, and then goes on to tell you how to find the best subjects to shoot up close. Also included is a chapter on macro lighting and even one on doing macro abstracts, and one for creating graphic designs using things like bird feathers. The macro images in this ebook are typical Zuckerman quality as you can see for yourself with this cover image of the frog in a flower.

My new impressions of ebooks now is that they are on the small side as compared to printed ones, but I did still find that this one has plenty of information in it, and best of all, at a lot less price than what a regular book cost.


Painting with a Lens: The Digital Photographer's Guide to Designing Artistic Images In-Camera by Rob and Robin Deutschmann
